# SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

## **Keep My Commandments**

In today's Gospel, Jesus makes a very simple statement when He says, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." And then towards the end He somewhat repeats Himself by saying, "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me."

Observing the commandments is a rather straightforward thing. We know what they are and what they entail. They tell us what we should do and what we should not do. And if we go against them, then we are sinning. And in the manner or degree that we sin, that is the manner or measure in which we do not love Jesus. There is no way around this.

You may know people who say, "Oh, I am a Catholic, but I don't agree with what the Catholic Church says about birth control or abortion." Or, "I don't agree with the Church about women's ordination." You may hear other questions or comments. And this can also refer to things the Church teaches about which we must believe. For example, we know that there are some Catholics who don't really believe in our Lord's real presence in the Blessed Sacrament.

Jesus also speaks about sending the Holy Spirit who will teach you all the truth. We know that Jesus kept this promise first of all on Pentecost when he descended on the Apostles. Jesus also promised that this Holy Spirit would be with His Church till the end of time. The

fact that His Church is still in existence is proof that He has kept His promise. There have been many bleak moments in the history of the church, and yet, somehow or other the Church has always come through. And it will always come through because of the presence of the Holy Spirit.

We are reminded today that we are called to love Jesus; that is part of the Christian calling. Those who keep Christ's commandments will. promises, receive the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit, our advocate will gently indicate the way to us that we should go, the paths that repaired, need be to relationships in need of further inspection or care. For this Advocate, the Spirit of Truth, is a gift from God. And being from God, it can never do harm, never do wrong, never lead us into danger. We may, of course, be led in ways that we did not expect or anticipate, but if we are truly open to God and all His gifts than we must also be open to go where He would will for us to go.

So let us ask ourselves once again: Do we earnestly and genuinely want the Spirit of



Truth to enter into our hearts and stay with us always?

If we are at all uncertain about any of our answers to this question, then let us pray—pray that we might truly be open to the Scriptures, open to God, open to Jesus and what he asks of us in love.

And pray that as Pentecost approaches we too might become filled with "The Divine presence of the Holy Spirit" and completely open to the love and freedom in Christ that is promised to us as a result.

Do I really have hope? Am I a person of hope? And we can remind ourselves that this hope does not depend on us, on our strength and determination, but wholly on God's love for us in Christ, shown in his resurrection. And this is the Good News of today.



During this time, we would like to inform all parishioners within our parish of a few important things.




